Mr. Chair,

The principle of Universal Jurisdiction has given rise to many discussions among

lawyers, diplomats and in civil society. It has raised various concerns and was

sometimes also cause for international tensions. While we support the basic idea of

universal jurisdiction, in the interest of the common fight against impunity, we see a

considerable amount of confusion and misapprehension that exists with regard to the

concept of universal jurisdiction.

We are therefore of the view that a thorough discussion of the substance of the topic

can be very useful, and that such a thorough discussion should be carried out in an

efficient as well as a professional manner.

We commend the chair of the working group on Universal Jurisdiction, Ambassador

Ulibarri, for his able guidance of our work in the 6th committee on the topic, in

particular for guiding the work on the informal working paper.

Nevertheless, we do not see that the 6th committee is the right forum for discussing

such a highly complex legal topic. In particular, this topic needs first a scientific

analysis in order to avoid certain misunderstandings that still sometimes govern the

discussions.

We therefore have sympathy for the idea put forward by other delegations to request

the International Law Commission, the competent suborgan of the United Nations

General Assembly, to embark on this topic.

We are confident that this very important legal topic would be in very good hands with

the ILC.
