Finding Solutions to State-to-State Conflicts: Legal Proceedings & Peace Building

States embroiled in regional conflicts are increasingly bringing their disputes to adjudicatory proceedings before international courts and tribunals. As seen recently in, for example, the Gulf dispute and the dispute between Ukraine and Russia, States are availing themselves of a number of international dispute resolution fora, including the International Court of Justice, to bring legal claims. Such proceedings not only stand as a means to create accountability, but can also create opportunities for broader peace-building efforts.

Even where a court or tribunal is unlikely to arrive at a final or comprehensive solution to a dispute—due to jurisdictional limits or the nature of the dispute—the adjudicatory process may still be fruitful in, among other things: drawing out each party's perspective on international law; developing evidence and factual bases underlying the dispute; or, when taking place in tandem with political measures, building pressure on the parties to make progress. In some instances, legal proceedings can have the effect of avoiding military action.

This panel will address the following issues in exploring legal proceedings as leverage for purposes of resolving State-to-State conflicts:

- The interplay between legal proceedings, political engagements, and peacebuilding efforts;
- The types of claims and disputes most (and least) suitable to legal fora; and
- Strategic considerations in choice of a venue (ICJ, PCA, ITLOS, conciliation mechanisms, regional courts, etc.).
