Serious Violations of the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives in Norway and measures taken to bring offenders to justice

2021

Iranian Embassy

Tagging of political slogan on Chancery outer wall. The case was reported and investigated.

Myanmar Embassy

The Embassy received threat letters. The Embassy security office of the Norwegian Police followed up with threat assessments with a view to preventing a repetition of such violations.

2020

Turkish Embassy

A private individual vandalized equipment at the Chancery entry. The case was reported and investigated. The offender was penalized with a fine.

2018

Iranian Embassy

Three instances of vandalism towards the Iranian Embassy of Oslo. The vandalism consisted of tagging of political slogans on the Chancery outer wall. Two individuals were sentenced to prison for 45 days in accordance with the Norwegian Criminal Code § 351.

Measures taken to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives as well as missions and representatives with diplomatic status to international intergovernmental organizations;

2021

Amendment of the Norwegian Criminal Code § 184

The Norwegian Criminal Code § 184 which prohibits violation of the missions and representatives of foreign states was amended to include violations towards the missions and representatives of international intergovernmental organizations, and also violations of family members of the representatives of foreign states and international intergovernmental organizations.
