Mr. President,

Angola congratulates the Secretary-General on his Report on

strengthening and coordinating United Nations activities to promote

the rule of law contained in the document (A/78/184).

My delegation aligns itself with the statements delivered by the

Republic of Uganda on behalf of the African Group.

Mr. President,

Angola recognizes that the rule of law at the international level refers

to the idea that all nations should be governed by established

international laws, principles, and norms. However, we are aware

that the state of international law may vary depending on the

circumstances and actions of countries.

Angola understands that the application of the concept of the

international rule of law includes, among others, respect for

international treaties and agreements, the peaceful settlement of

disputes, the fight against impunity for international crimes, and the

protection of human rights.

We believe that it is important for the consolidation of the

international rule of law that the channels of a permanent dialogue

among Member States remain open. Another key issue is the

relevance of the United Nations assistance in strengthening the rule

of law and how to strengthen its sustainability and coherence in the

principles that guide the organization, as well as respect for the

sovereign decisions of States.

In the last decade, instability has worsened worldwide, particularly

in Africa, because of the intensification of unconstitutional changes

of democratically elected governments, compromising International

Law and the economic and social development of States.

Mr. President,

The Republic of Angola has a stable legal and judicial system and

respects the principles of justice and equality before the law. It has

created instruments that facilitate the implementation of universal

legal frameworks.

We are looking for the best solutions to effectively fight against

international crimes and other related problems that affect the

international community.

For this, we are strengthening the capacity of institutions such as

the Courts, the Attorney General's Office, and the Criminal

Investigation Service, in order to guarantee the effective

implementation of the law at the national level through democratic

precepts.
