## Introduction of the draft resolution "Report of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law on the work of its fifty-sixth session" (A/C.6/78/L.7) (agenda item 77)

## 17 November 2023

Mr. Chair,

I have the honor to introduce the draft resolution, entitled "Report of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law on the work of its fifty-sixth session", as contained in document A/C.6/78/L.7, on behalf of all the co-sponsors listed in L.7.

I'd like to announce that the following Member States also join in sponsoring the draft resolution: Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Denmark, Peru, Philippines, Russian Federation, Serbia, United Kingdom, United States of America and Zambia.

The draft resolution is based on resolution 77/99 adopted last year, and incorporates the developments and recommendations set forth in the latest report of UNCITRAL. I will now address the following major changes:

- OP2a commends UNCITRAL's progress made in the context of investor-state dispute settlement reform
- OP2b commends work finalized in the area of micro, small and medium-sized enterprises on access to credit
- OP2c commends the adoption of a guidance text on early dismissal and preliminary determination in the area of dispute settlement
- OP3 acknowledges the holding of a colloquium on climate change and international trade law on 12 and 13 July 2023
- OP6 reflects the advance stage of the draft model law on warehouse receipts
- OP7 welcomes the publication of a toolkit on the coronavirus disease and international trade law instruments
- OP8 welcomes further exploratory work regarding aspects of international trade law related to voluntary carbon credits

## Mr. Chair,

In my view, the text of the draft resolution represents a consensus among delegations. Therefore, I recommend that the Sixth Committee adopt the draft resolution without a vote.
