ORDER No. 61 (2011)

1. On 11 March 2011, the United Nations Appeals Tribunal (Appeals Tribunal) issued Judgment No. 2011-UNAT-112 in the case of *Abbasi v. Secretary-General of the United Nations.*

2. On 18 May 2011, Farzana Shaheen Abbasi (Abbasi) wrote to the Registry to submit a request for revision against the above Judgment. On 25 May 2011, the Registry replied to Abbasi stating that the submission could not be accepted as filed, that it was unclear, and asked her to re-submit by 1 June 2011. Abbasi failed to comply with this time limit.

3. On 1 August 2011, Abbasi provided authorization for a new counsel and stated that she intended to file an application for interpretation of judgment and an application for revision of judgment. She requests a 30-day extension to file the request for interpretation on the grounds that she was a victim of a vicious and brutal abduction, which inter alia entailed a loss of the documents relevant to her case. She also stated that she was forced to change counsel.

4. I have considered Abbasi's request and believe that a 30-day extension is not warranted, seeing that Abbasi has not made the effort to provide documentation in support of her motion. Given however the severity of Abbasi's allegations as well as the presumption that she acts in good faith, I allow the motion, in part, and grant a 15-day extension to file her application for interpretation, if any.
