Introduction

1. On 17 April 2025, the Applicant filed a rejoinder pursuant to Order No. 43 (NBI/2025). On the issue of receivability, the Applicant submits at paras. 6 and 7 of the rejoinder that,

The Applicant's Counsel will provide an affidavit or statement explaining 4 hour impediment portal-related issues encountered during the eFiling process. However, she respectfully submits that her application was filed well within the applicable limits and is properly receivable.

The technicality of "58 minutes" must be weighed against the substantive justice imperative and the principle of access to justice, particularly in employment disputes where the employment relationship is at stake.

The Applicant's Counsel is yet to file the said affidavit or statement.

2. The Applicant's Counsel shall file an affidavit explaining the "4 hour impediment portal-related issues encountered during the eFiling process" by **Thursday, 16 October 2025**.
