Introduction

1. The Applicant in this case serves as a Security Officer with the United Nations

Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS).

2. He challenges the Respondent's denial of an Education Grant for his (then)

three-year-old son. The Education Grant applications were submitted for the

2022-23 and 2023-24 academic years. The Applicant's claim is premised on the

contention that "compulsory education" begins at the age of three in his home

country, Israel.

3. The Respondent, in his reply, moves the Tribunal to dismiss the application

as lacking in merit. The Respondent submits that the impugned decision was

properly made and is lawful.

Consideration

4. The Tribunal has considered the parties' submissions and deems it

appropriate to give the Applicant the opportunity to respond to the Respondent's

reply on the specific point of the law in respect of compulsory schooling in Israel.

In other words, the Tribunal requires the Applicant to submit documentary evidence

showing that Israeli law mandates compulsory schooling at the age of three.

Conclusion

5. The Applicant is therefore directed to file the document on the law in support

of his claim by Thursday, 20 November 2025.
