Introduction

1. On 27 February 2021, the Applicant filed an application contesting the decisions to: (a) deny his request for Special Post Allowance (“SPA”) from 27 March 2016 to 27 October 2017 (“SPA decision”); (b) update the Terms of References (ToRs) for his position (“ToRs decision”); and (c) not reclassify the post he encumbers (“Reclassification decision”) (collectively, contested decisions).

2. On 6 April 2021, the Respondent filed his reply submitting that the SPA decision and the reclassification decision are not receivable *ratione materiae*, and in any case are lawful decisions. The Respondent further contends that the ToRs decision was lawful.

Consideration

3. Having reviewed the parties’ submissions, the Tribunal considers it appropriate and in the interest of justice to direct the parties to file further submissions.

4. Pursuant to art. 19 of the Dispute Tribunal’s Rules of Procedure and for a fair disposal of the case,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

5. By **4:00 p.m. on Monday, 15 November 2021**, the Applicant is to file a response to the Respondent’s reply, including responding to the Respondent’s submissions on receivability. The submission is to be five pages maximum, using Times New Roman, font 12 and 1.5 line spacing.

6. By **4:00 p.m. on Monday, 22 November 2021**, the Respondent may file a response to the Applicant's further submissions. The submission is to be five pages maximum, using Times New Roman, font 12 and 1.5 line spacing.
7. Thereafter, the Tribunal will give further directions as it deems appropriate.
