



REMARKS BY H.E. MR. VOLKAN BOZKIR PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY International Day of Reflection on the 1994 Genocide Against the Tutsi in Rwanda

My heart is with all Rwandans today. Those who have suffered, those who have experienced loss, those who demonstrate resilience every day, and the new generation, who have inherited this heavy burden of grief.

I commend your dedication, to reconciliation and a brighter future.
