Sir,

I have the honour to write to you in reference to Colombia's Action Plan for the implementation of United Nations Security Council resolution 1540 (2004).

I attach herewith the National Action Plan prepared by Colombia in collaboration with the Organization of American States (OAS) Inter-American Committee against Terrorism, the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004) and the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs. I would appreciate it if you could have the attached document included and published in your Committee's list of action plans.

Colombia's Action Plan contains areas of cooperation to strengthen national capacity in the implementation of resolution 1540 (2004). Specifically, the Plan addresses improvements in four aspects of national strategies: prevention, response, recovery and equipment. The aim is to deal with the risk posed by the development, use and acquisition of weapons of mass destruction and their means of delivery by non-State actors.

Decides further that all States shall take and enforce effective measures to establish domestic controls to prevent the proliferation of nuclear, chemical, or biological weapons and their means of delivery, including by establishing appropriate controls over related materials, and to this end shall: (a) Develop and maintain appropriate effective measures to account for and secure such items in production, use, storage or transport; (b) Develop and maintain appropriate effective physical protection measures;"</p> <p>"10. Further calls upon all States, as a means to further counter that threat, to take cooperative action, in accordance with their national legal authorities and legislation and consistent with international law, to prevent illicit trafficking in nuclear, chemical or biological weapons, their means of delivery, and related materials;"</p>
