Background

The Technical Secretariat of the OPCW and the government of the State of Qatar jointly organised the conference, The Conference was held in connection with the celebration of the OPCW's 20th founding anniversary. The objectives of the Conference were to:

- Highlight the contributions of the OPCW to chemical disarmament and security in the past 20 years;
- Create a forum for discussions on the experiences of the international community and achievements to date in chemical disarmament and security, and enable participants to exchange views on future directions and priorities;
- Facilitate understanding of current approaches to chemical security and identify trends as well as areas that need to be addressed.

Highlights

The proceedings of the conference included three panel discussions on the following topics:

- International, regional and national regulatory mechanisms and networks;
- Industry initiatives; and,
- Current and emerging threats.
- The panellists in each session were comprised of experts from international, regional and national organisations and entities, who discussed and shared their knowledge and experiences from a variety of perspectives on chemical security and preventing proliferation.
