

Indonesia Response to the Survey of National Reporting on NSDS

1. Is your country implementing an approach NSDS or its equivalent?

Yes, Indonesia has a similar NSDS document so called National Development Program (*Program Pembangunan Nasional/PROPENAS*) which include all sustainable development aspects inside. The new government is modifying the National Development Program to become a National Mid Term Development Plan (*Rencana Pembangunan Jangka Menengah/RPJM*) which also emphasis the aspects of sustainable development plan will refer to the National Mid Term Development Plan which would be legalized through Presidential Regulation on the third week of January 2005.

a) Do your country have national body designated to implement and/or monitor your country's NSDS (or its equivalent)

Yes. The implementation of the RPJM would be done by all sectoral agencies and local government. In the national level, for this time being, the National Development Planning Board (*Badan Perencanaan Pembangunan Nasional/BAPPENAS*) has a task monitor and evaluate the performance of activities stated in RPJM in annual basis. In the near future, we consider a function or a better mechanism or establishment of an institution that could comprehensively monitor and evaluate the NSDS according to the Law No. 25/2004 concerning National Development Planning System (NDPS).

b) How is your NSDS (or its equivalent) being implemented? Please give specific action/activities undertaken for this purposes?.

Up to fiscal year 2004, Propenas had been implemented by all line agencies through our regular project implementation which had been approved by the government and parliament. Later, commencing 2005, the Government would use the same approach for the RPJM

c) Is the implementation of NSDS (or equivalent) being monitored and evaluated?.

PROPENAS had been monitored on regular basis, in term of programs achievement and fund disbursement. According to the Law No. 25/2004 concerning NDPS, monitoring and evaluation would be done by all line agencies and local governments. National Development Planning Board and Local Government Planning Board will collect all necessary information from the result of monitoring and evaluation for the basis preparation of the annual government work program and the next RPJM. Ministry of Environment, would strongly advice and recommend substantively the draft of RPJM to make sure that sustainable development principle has been accommodated in the document.

2. Does your country have NSDS or its equivalent approved by the government but not yet implemented

Yes. The document so called a National Mid Term Development Plan (*Rencana Pembangunan Jangka Menengah/RPJM*). The document would expectedly be approved through the format of Presidential Regulation on January 2005. Subsequently all sectors and local governments would implement it.

6. If your country has develop poverty reduction strategy (PRS) but not a NSDS.

Does your country's PRS incorporate and integrate environmental, economic and social aspects of development.

Yes, definitely.

Yes, The PRS contains the same time frame, macro economic targets, and action plan from various ministries and regions. The strategy adopted in the PRS also consider the overall strategy as stated in the NSDS. The National Development Planning Board has roles to coordinate and prepare the PRS document in collaboration with line ministries.

8. Does your country's PRS or NSDS address the Millennium Development Goal (MDGs)

Yes. All targets in MDG have been incorporated in the NSDS and PRS documents.
