  - Implementation of good practices; training actions for capacity building; training on monitoring systems

Description: Member countries received permanent technical assistance on the preparation of project documents, implementation of projects, and monitoring on SFM. Success stories are also documented for easy reference. (continuos)

Member countries through the FAO representation in countries prepared their planning. From 33 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean at least 27 request FAO support on forest legislation, adaptation, SFM, monitoring, restoration, plantation.

(iii) Financial actions; Preparation of project proposals for the green climate fund different windows including REDD and full proposals. GEF projects for SFM, and/or including these practices. Project on protected areas.

Description: GEF focal points and/or National Designated Authorities requested FAO to support on the preparation of project documents to be submitted to donors. Process include the planning with national authorities, academia, communities involved, and private sector mainly small owners for the preparation of project documents More than 64 projects have being approved by donors.

(iv) Technical and scientific actions: monitoring and reporting on forest cover and forest cover change; forest types and biodiversity.

Description: FAO developed an integrated model to implement forest inventories including use and users of forests and NWFP. In LAC the method has being adapted in many countries and has being adopted by the forestry offices. Data collection also include biodiversity, carbon and biomass variable.

All mechanisms listed above support countries on the implementation of their forestry policy if they have it, or on the preparation/update of it. Project contribute to fund actions of restoration, applying good practices, capacity building, appropriate governance of forest and strength the forestry sector in the countries. Monitor and reporting contribute to evaluate the effectiveness of national policies and the state of forest in countries.
