Voluntary National Report on progress towards the implementation of the UN Strategic Plan for Forests 2017–2030, the UN Forest Instrument and Voluntary National Contributions

Thank you for taking the time to complete the voluntary national report to the UN Forum on Forests (UNFF). Before you start, please take note of the following important information:

1. The Economic and Social Council, in its resolution 2022/17, requested the UNFF secretariat to amend the format for voluntary national reporting to the Forum, taking into account the suggestions and proposals received from members of the Forum, and conduct a pilot phase for the use of the refined format. In the same resolution, the Council invited the Forum to consider establishing an advisory group on reporting. It further requested that the secretariat explore options for establishing an online reporting platform for the Forum, recognizing the need for streamlined reporting and minimizing the reporting burden, including the challenges faced by developing countries.
2. In fulfilling this mandate, the UNFF Secretariat has amended the format, taking into account the suggestions and proposals received from Members of the Forum and in consultation with the advisory group on reporting. The secretariat has also established an online reporting platform for the submission of voluntary national reports to the Forum.
3. The amended format is structured around the Global Forest Goals and targets of the UN Strategic Plan for Forests 2017–2030 (UNSPF) and builds on the previous format that was used for reporting to the UNFF15.
4. The amended format consists of twelve sections, each with several questions:

 2. Progress toward Global Forest Goal 1 and associated targets
 3. Progress toward Global Forest Goal 2 and associated targets
 4. Progress toward Global Forest Goal 3 and associated targets

Action (short title):

Brief description of the action:

The forest area in Sweden has been stable during the last 100 years. Some forests have been converted to settlements or infrastructure while new forests have established on abandoned agricultural land.

Today about 28 million ha is under forest cover in our country, which correspond to 68% of the land area. According to the Forestry Act the forest owner has a requirement of regeneration after final felling. Compulsory regeneration of forests is a key component of the national forest legislation since 1903.

Action (short title):**Brief description of the action:**

Sweden assesses that active, sustainable forest management with high growth and the use of products from renewable raw materials provide the highest long-term climate benefit. Renewable raw materials are needed to substitute fossil-intensive resources both in Sweden and in other countries. To increase the climate benefit of forests, both for substitution and for increased net removals, efforts for increased growth, good forest health and a growing circular bioeconomy are necessary. There is further a great potential to increase carbon sequestration and the proportion of renewable materials in construction by utilizing more forest products.

It is necessary to maintain and/or enhance the forest carbon sink. That can be done in various ways. For example, by restoration and protection of carbon-rich ecosystems such as peatlands, as this can contribute to a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions and even carbon sequestration. Since 2021, a total of 1000 hectares of forest on previously drained peatlands have been contracted for rewetting. The rewetting measures have long-term funding with the ambition to significantly increase restored area.

Another example is limiting wildlife browsing damage to forests which currently can hamper increased forest growth.

The Swedish forest carbon stock has been rather stable over the years, at least since 2000 according to FAO FRA 2020.

Brief description of the action:

The Swedish Forestry Act is the foundation for sustainable forest management in Sweden. In addition to this we have over the years worked actively, both at national and international levels, to promote sustainable forest management. Internationally Sweden is active in various international processes and by bilateral and regional development cooperation towards developing countries. At national level sustainable forest management is promoted by extension services towards forest owners.

Ultimately, sustainable forest management is an iterative process in which the goals for balancing the forest's ecological, economic and social functions are decided through the democratic process of governmental and parliamentary decisions. In this respect, the political and societal discussion on forests has been very active and present during the last few years and several official governmental inquiries and reports with broad participation from political parties, science and stakeholders have recently been presented.

As a Member State of the European Union (EU), Sweden currently implements the EU Deforestation Regulation (<https://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/PDF/?uri=CELEX:32023R1115>), which aims to reduce the EU's impact on global deforestation and forest degradation by ensuring that certain products placed on the EU market are deforestation-free, as well as the Nature Restoration Law (https://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/PDF/?uri=OJ:L_202401991), which aims at restoring degraded ecosystems across the Union. Sweden also implements the LULUCF regulation, Regulation (EU) 2018/841 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 30 May 2018 on the inclusion of greenhouse gas emissions and removals from land use, land use change and forestry in the 2030 climate and energy framework, and amending Regulation (EU) No 525/2013 and Decision No 529/2013/EU which regulates the net carbon removals in the land use sector to 2030.

Another example of Sweden's active engagement in promoting sustainable forest management is through chairmanship of Forest Europe – the custodian of sustainable forest management and its criteria and indicators in the pan-European region – on the 1st of January 2025.

In a changing climate we can foresee increased occurrence of natural disturbances such as, forest fires, storms, flooding etc. Sweden has for a long time worked to create resilient forests and to adapt the forests to be able to withstand various effects of a changed climate. In 2024 Sweden revised its national climate adaptation strategy (<https://www.regeringen.se/rattsliga-dokument/skrivelse/2024/03/skr.-20232497>), which also includes the forest.

This strategy is the basis for the Swedish Forest Agency's extension service towards forest owners on the need to adapt and reduce the impact on forests from climate change and to make the forests more resilient. The Swedish Forest Agency is also mandated by the Ordinance on climate adaptation (2018:1428) to initiate, support and evaluate the work on adaptation in their area of responsibility.

In addition, the Forest Agency is using remote sensing to monitor the forest development trends as well as identifying risks for larger disturbances (forest fires, storms, outbreak of insects etc.).

The Swedish context is as follows: Sweden has a stable forest area with a stable governance. According to the Forestry Act the forest owner has a requirement of regeneration after final felling. Main challenges concerns adaptation to climate change as well as balancing various interests regarding land use.

Brief description of the action:

The right of public access allows anyone to explore Sweden's nature –whether it's picking berries, hiking trails, or pitching a tent in the forest. This gives the general public right to be out in any forest for e.g. picking berries or mushrooms, which could contribute to food security in the country. However, the right of public access does not give you the right to hunt. The hunting right belongs to the landowner.

Another example related to forest and food security is that the Swedish government promote the use of wild boar meat and incentives for hunters to shoot more wild boars. Wild boar must be tested for trichinella, and the tests are subsidized for hunters since 2021. Furthermore, government has simplified for hunters to sell wild boar meat to consumers. In March 2025 the Government released an updated version of its food strategy for creation of more jobs and growth in the entire country. The strategy has also some connection to forests (<https://www.regeringen.se/rattsliga-dokument/departementsserien-och-promemorior/2025/03/livsmedelsstrategin-2.0>).

Sweden maintains an active and multifunctional forest sector governed by the Forestry Act, which balances production and environmental objectives. This approach contributes to biodiversity conservation and climate benefits, in line with both national environmental objectives and international commitments. Furthermore, the revised version of the National strategy for the formal protection of forests from 2024

(<https://www.naturvardsverket.se/4aeb49/globalassets/media/publikationer-pdf/7100/978-91-620-7168-4.pdf>) is aiming that the formal protection of forests shall contribute to achieving Sweden's environmental objectives (<https://www.naturvardsverket.se/en/om-miljoarbetet/swedish-environmental-objectives/>) and international goals for preserving biodiversity. In addition, the EU adopted in 2024 the Nature Restoration Regulation, which is applicable for all EU Member States.

In relation to climate change, the revised national climate adaptation strategy (<https://www.regeringen.se/rattsliga-dokument/skrivelse/2024/03/skr.-20232497>) from 2024 do also include forest and forestry aspects.

The Environmental Objectives Committee is monitoring developments and providing suggestions on how Sweden should achieve the 16 national environmental objectives. It has newly presented proposals aimed at ensuring that Sweden meets its commitments in biodiversity and net removals of greenhouse gases from the land use sector. The Government is now considering those proposals.

The National Forest Inquiry presented in 2025 also looked into various environmental indicators .

Brief description of the action:

Sweden maintains a multifunctional forestry sector governed by the Forestry Act, which ensures a balance between production and environmental values. This approach includes both sustainable forest management and the designation of forest areas for biodiversity and conservation purposes.

The revised version of the National strategy for the formal protection of forests from 2024 (<https://www.naturvardsverket.se/4aeb49/globalassets/media/publikationer-pdf/7100/978-91-620-7168-4.pdf>) is aiming at the formal protection of forests shall contribute to achieving Sweden's environmental objectives and international goals for preserving biodiversity. In addition the EU adopted in 2024 the Nature Restoration Regulation (https://environment.ec.europa.eu/topics/nature-and-biodiversity/nature-restoration-regulation_en) which is applicable for all EU Member States.

According to national statistics (<https://www.scb.se/en/finding-statistics/statistics-by-subject-area/housing-construction-and-building/land-use/formally-protected-forest-land-voluntary-set-asides-consideration-patches-and-unproductive-forest-land/>) forest areas exempted from forestry operations, in favour of biological diversity and cultural values, has increased from 26% to 27% of the total forest area between 2020 and 2024. This includes formal protected forest land, voluntary set-asides, consideration patches and unproductive forest land. Of this, the formally protected areas have increased from 8.7% to 9.4% during the same period. As regards the category "unproductive forest land" – this is forest that has an annual growth of less than 1 cubic meter per hectare per year. These forests are protected by the Forestry Act and harvesting is not allowed. These forests often occur on mires or in the high mountains and have considerable biodiversity values.

Sweden contributes to the global targets for biodiversity conservation and sustainable forest use both through formal protection and integrated conservation in active forest management.

The Swedish Forest Agency provides all forest owners - for free - with an online GIS tool with a host of (remote sensing) information, maps and planning tools for their forests, (<https://www.skogsstyrelsen.se/e-tjanster-och-kartor/mina-sidor/>). Forest owners can use this GIS tool even for making their own forest management plan. This GIS tool is continuously under development. Forest owners can e.g. use this tool to directly send in their harvesting notifications to the Swedish Forest Agency, including obligatory information on what environmental consideration will be taken during harvesting and how regeneration will be carried out.

All forest land in Sweden is managed in line with sustainable forest management principles, supported by national legislation. The Swedish Forestry Act requires forest owners to ensure regeneration, maintain biodiversity, soil productivity and take environmental considerations into account during operations. About 66 percent of all productive forest land outside formal protection, is managed in line with at least one of the voluntary certification schemes, PEFC or FSC.

In 2025 the Swedish government established a Council on the Forest Industry Value Chain. The Council serves as an advisory body and platform for dialogue and experience-sharing with stakeholders in the forest sector.

Through robust national legislation, widespread certification, and proactive policy development, Sweden contributes with products originate from sustainably managed forests. By significant export, Sweden also contributes to increasing the global availability of forest products from sustainably managed forests.

The Swedish governance structure is robust. The Swedish Forest Agency (the forest authority) is among other tasks responsible for the forest law enforcement, monitoring of the forest development and giving advice to forest owners. It is of great importance in the implementation of the forest policy, that has been decided by the Parliament, to have a constructive dialogue with various stakeholders. Through the technology development the Forest Agency has been more efficient in forest monitoring. For example, biweekly national cover satellite imagery is automatically checked against the GIS registry of forestry owners' harvesting notifications (polygons on maps) in order to ensure compliance with the Forestry Act. In addition Sweden together with the other EU Member States are about to going from implementing the EU Timber Regulation (<https://www.skogsstyrelsen.se/en/laws-and-regulations/eu-timber-regulation/>) to implementation of the EU Deforestation Regulation (<https://www.skogsstyrelsen.se/en/laws-and-regulations/regulation-on-Deforestation-free-products/>), which promotes the consumption of deforestation-free products.
