

Gary S. Belkin, M.D., PhD, is a psychiatrist who serves as Deputy Director of Psychiatry at Bellevue Hospital Center in New York City, where he is also Associate Professor in the New York University (NYU) School of Medicine. Dr. Belkin is involved in several projects aimed to extend the uses of community-based mental health strategies in New York City and internationally, and exploring the degree they can be used for larger social policy and public health purposes. This includes oversight of a mental health intervention as part of the Millennium Village Project- a multi-year effort across 10 countries in Africa, to demonstrate the effectiveness and scalability of sustainable key interventions in extreme poverty settings for meeting the Millennium Development Goals. He directs the Program in Global Public Mental Health at Bellevue/NYU, and with a doctorate as well in history, writes about the development of health policy and uses of ethics and values in healthcare, from a historical perspective. Recent efforts are concerned with how to model, and critically assess the evidence used to support, effective uses of mental health and psychological infrastructures and expertise, for conflict prevention and post-conflict management and recovery.
