- MSPs: differentiation by purpose
 → dialogue as one possible purpose
- Differentiation by nature of communication
 - → dialogue as one possible form



- ... are processes of decision-finding (and possibly decision-making) that aim to:
- bring together all major stakeholders in equitable representation;
- achieve equity and accountability in communication between stakeholders;
- are based on democratic principles of transparency and participation.

• • • Governance

MSPs:

- o a new phenomenon in governance
- responding to the need for inclusion and effectiveness
- implying significant changes in institutional and political culture

• • Different Kinds of MSPs

- Scale: global local
- Issues
- Participants
- Linkage to official decision-making
- Scope: from dialogue to collaborative action (partnerships) to joint M&E

• • • Principal Benefits

- Quality
- Credibility
- Likelihood of implementation
- Outreach
- Democratic development; conflict prevention

• • Principal Risks

- Undue & biased stakeholder influence
- Lack of transparency towards the outside
- Reputational risk of suboptimal processes
- Participants & their constituencies drifting apart
- Dialogue fatigue
