- ◆ Mandatory Energy Standards
 - A set of procedures and regulations that prescribe the energy performance of manufactured products
 - Some cases, Mandatory energy standards refers to maximum energy consumption limits
 - Eliminate inefficient products from the Market

Definitions and Strategies

- Voluntary Energy Standards
 - Information to consumers
 - ◆ Targets for Manufacturers
 - Market Driven

Program Components

- Mandatory Energy Standards
 - Regulation and Legal instrument in place
 - well-defined Testing Protocol and sufficient Testing Facilities
 - Certification Administration
 - Monitoring and Enforcement

Program Components

- Voluntary Energy Standards
 - Promotion Activities
 - Testing Procedures and Testing facilities
 - Program Adjustment and Update
 - Complementary Programs (e.g. incentives)

Essential Parts and Costs

- Mandatory Energy Standards
 - Requires time for legal setup
 - Requires Monitoring and Enforcing System/Efforts
 - Manufacturer Cooperation

Essential Parts and Costs

- Voluntary Energy Standards
 - Intensive Promotional Activities
 - Easy to understand materials/labeling
 - Manufacturers Cooperation
