INTRODUCTION

In 2010, the United Nations, through the One UN Programme, launched the programme 'Empowering Vulnerable Local Communities of Albania'. The programme seeks to assist the most marginalized Roma and Egyptian communities and contribute to their social integration while respecting their diversity. It supports the participation of Roma and Egyptian communities in local decision making through identifying their development priorities and preparing and implementing community development plans.

Assistance provided through the programme enables targeted communities in the regions of Tirana, Durres, Elbasan and Fier to access their rights, particularly to access to public services through promoting civil registration, undertakes community policing through establishment and strengthening of a network of Roma mediators, provides support in the areas of health, education and child protection, and facilitates vocational training and employment.

In partnership with the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities (MoLSAEO) and local institutions, the programme is implemented by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), while the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) provides advisory support in the area of civil registration. The programme also involves United Nations Volunteers (UNVs), who work in communities with local stakeholders and promote volunteerism. The intervention will continue until 2013 and is funded by the Government of Japan through the United Nations Trust Fund for Human Security.

This brochure explains the people-centred development that has taken place in Albania through community mobilization activities undertaken from 2010 to 2011. The photographs and quotes of beneficiaries taken from the activities highlight the participation of Roma and Egyptians in the self-empowerment process.

ACCESS TO RIGHTS: CIVIL REGISTRATION










