# UNDT/2013/011, Bauza Mercere

#### **UNAT Held or UNDT Pronouncements**

The new system consists of a modernization of the system in place and does not change the staff members preexisting obligation to accurately reflect their working hours. The Applicant has not provided the Tribunal with any persuasive arguments that would result in it to consider that the implementation of the Flex Time System infringed on either his contract of employment or his terms of appointment. The implementation of a practice, which is used to address specific needs of a department, does not become discriminatory solely due to the fact that other departments within the Organization do not require it. The Tribunal decides that the application is not receivable ratione materiae.

## Decision Contested or Judgment/Order Appealed

The Applicant contests the implementation by the Department of General Assembly and Conference Management ("DGACM") of the decision to replace a paper based recording system that kept track of staff members' time and attendance with an electronic one named "Flex Time System".
