#### **UNAT Held or UNDT Pronouncements**

Disciplinary investigations: are not criminal in nature and the evidential standards that apply to criminal investigations do not apply. The decision maker cannot exclude the evidence obtained by an unlawful interview from consideration but the weight of the evidence obtained in unfair or unlawful circumstances should be treated with the utmost caution.

#### Decision Contested or Judgment/Order Appealed

The Applicant was formerly a Senior Finance Clerk in Khartoum, Sudan, on a fixed-term contract at the G-5 level with the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). She is contesting the High Commissioner's decision of 13 October 2011 to dismiss her for serious misconduct following an investigation by the Inspector General's Office (IGO) into allegations that she had submitted a fraudulent claim to the United Nations Medical Insurance Plan (MIP) Programme.
