

# 2012-UNAT-241, Muratore

## UNAT Held or UNDT Pronouncements

UNAT held that UNDT had correctly found that the application was not receivable. UNAT dismissed the appeal and affirmed the UNDT judgment.

## Decision Contested or Judgment/Order Appealed

The Applicant contested the decision of the Ethics Office that considered that the events he had reported did not demonstrate any professional misconduct for the purposes of ST/SGB/2005/21. UNDT found that the application was not receivable *ratione temporis* since the Applicant had failed to submit his request for administrative review within the two-month time limit.
