Background

Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 77/321, the Office of Legal Affairs of the United Nations through its Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea ("the Division"), is implementing a programme of activities, including capacity-building and technical assistance activities, to promote a better understanding of the Agreement under the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea on the Conservation and Sustainable Use of Marine Biological Diversity of Areas beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ Agreement) and to prepare for its entry into force.

This programme of activities includes regional workshops, technical assistance at the national level, briefings and side events, and the development of capacity-building and outreach tools and materials. In order to deliver on these activities this consultancy aims to create a set of video and graphic assets on the BBNJ Agreement and the Division's programme of activities as outlined in the deliverables section below.

Work Location

The Animation Production Consultancy will be home based.

Duties and Responsibilities

Under the overall supervision of the Director of the Division and a Senior Legal Officer, the consultant shall report to a Legal Officer.

The consultancy will undertake the production of a series of mixed media animation videos, social media assets and other graphic assets as detailed below. The production of mixed media animation videos under this consultancy will encompass: developing storyboard, script, and timeline; creating and animating graphics; capturing original content on location; incorporating audio and visual media; obtaining releases, licenses and copyright permissions for all media, including music; delivering to the Division all project assets and project media (via couriered external HDD); and working with the Division throughout production stages to create, review and finalize project assets.

The responsibility to obtain stock and any original audio, image or video media lies with the consultant, including any travel-related expenses, and other costs associated with obtaining such materials.

Scope of works and deliverables

The main deliverables of the consultancy are the following:

- 1. One mixed media animation video of 5 to 10 minutes on the BBNJ Agreement, incorporating audio and visual media, including original content captured under this contract. The video will have a broad target audience (general public, government officials, parliamentarians) and should address the following components:
 - a. The BBNJ Agreement overview;
 - b. Overview of four key elements addressed under the BBNJ Agreement:
 - i. marine genetic resources, including the fair and equitable sharing of benefits;
 - ii. measures such as area-based management tools, including marine protected areas;
 - iii. environmental impact assessments; and
 - iv. capacity-building and the transfer of marine technology;
 - c. The benefits of becoming party to the BBNJ Agreement; and
 - d. The benefits for the ocean that the BBNJ Agreement can provide.
- 2. Four thematic mixed media animation videos of around 30 seconds each for the general public, drawing media from the animated video of 5 to 10 minutes, with each video addressing one of the themes listed under 1 (a) to (d):
 - a. The BBNJ Agreement overview;
 - b. Overview of four key elements addressed under the BBNJ Agreement:
 - marine genetic resources, including the fair and equitable sharing of benefits;
 - ii. measures such as area-based management tools, including marine protected areas;
 - iii. environmental impact assessments; and
 - iv. capacity-building and the transfer of marine technology;
 - c. The benefits of becoming party to the BBNJ Agreement; and
 - d. The benefits for the ocean that the BBNJ Agreement can provide.
- 3. Five mixed media animation videos of 15 to 30 seconds which are suitable for use in presentations, website, and social media to promote the Division's programme of activities, incorporating audio and visual media, including original content captured under this contract. The videos will have government officials and parliamentarians as target audiences and each video will address one of the following topics:
 - a. General introduction to the Division's activities in capacity-building and specific pitch on the programme of activities on the BBNJ Agreement;

- b. Overview of capacity-building needs and priorities assessments highlighting the work the Division has done to assess the capacity-building needs and priorities of States in order to provide tailored capacity-building and technical assistance;
- c. Overview of the technical assistance being provided at the national level;
- d. Overview of the regional workshops being delivered by the Division; and
- e. Overview of the Division's activities to promote a better understanding of the BBNJ Agreement at relevant intergovernmental meetings.
- 4. Five social media carousels on the following:
 - a. Four social media carousels targeted at the general public, with one carousel on each of the four key elements addressed under the BBNJ Agreement (see 2(b) above) and content based on the factsheets developed by the Division; and
 - b. One social media carousel targeted at the general public on the benefits of the BBNJ Agreement for the ocean and humanity.
- 5. Graphic assets: developing five social media evergreen templates; and developing icon and image galleries for each of the four key elements addressed under the BBNJ Agreement (see 1(b) above), the benefits that can be provided by the BBNJ Agreement, as well as the Division's programme of activities. These galleries are intended to allow the Division easy access to icons and images for use in relevant presentations and other outreach materials.

The consultant will prepare monthly progress reports that will be shared with the Division.

All materials, including preliminary drafts, produced from this consultancy are the property of the United Nations.
