

Informal Consultations of States Parties to the United Nations Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks

Eighteenth round: "The thirtieth anniversary of the 1995 United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement: looking to the future"

Information for participants

Background

Following the entry into force of the United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement on 11 December 2001, pursuant to General Assembly resolution 56/13 of 28 November 2001, the Secretary-General convened an Informal Meeting of the States Parties to the Agreement for the purposes and objectives of, inter alia, considering the regional, subregional and global implementation of the Agreement; making any appropriate recommendations to the General Assembly on the scope and content of the annual report of the Secretary-General relating to the Agreement; and preparing for the review conference to be convened by the Secretary-General pursuant to article 36 of the Agreement. From 2002 to 2024, seventeen rounds of Informal Consultations of States Parties to the Agreement were convened to address a variety of related topics.

In paragraph 71 of resolution 79/145, the General Assembly recalled the recommendation of the resumed Review Conference in 2016 that the Informal Consultations of States Parties to the Agreement be dedicated, on an annual basis, to the consideration of specific issues arising from the implementation of the Agreement, with a view to improving understanding, sharing experiences and identifying best practices for the consideration of States Parties, as well as the General Assembly and the Review Conference.

Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 79/145, adopted on 12 December 2024, the eighteenth round of Informal Consultations of States Parties to the Agreement will be held, as an inperson meeting, at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 14 to 16 May 2025. Pursuant to paragraph 73 of that resolution 79/145, the eighteenth round of Informal Consultations of States Parties to the Agreement (ICSP-18) will focus its discussions on the topic "The thirtieth anniversary of the 1995 United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement: looking to the future".

ICSP-18 is an in person only meeting, with interpretation provided on an "as available" basis only.

In paragraph 75 of resolution 79/145, the General Assembly requested that the Secretary-General invite States parties to the Agreement and, as observers, States and entities referred to in the Convention and in article 1, paragraph 2 (b), of the Agreement not parties to the Agreement, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and other relevant organizations, bodies, funds and programmes within the United Nations system, the secretariats of relevant organizations and conventions and other relevant intergovernmental organizations and bodies, in particular subregional and regional fisheries management organizations and arrangements and related regional intergovernmental marine science organizations, and relevant non-governmental organizations, in accordance with past practice, to attend ICSP-18, while relevant scientific institutions may request an invitation to participate in the consultations as observers.
