09:30-10:00	 Session 1: Presentation on the Doha Programme of Action for LDCs (DPoA) and the Fifth UN Conference on the Least Developed Countries (LDC5) The Doha Programme of Action for the Least Developed Countries for the Decade 2022-2031 (DPoA) was adopted on 17 March 2022. The General Assembly endorsed the DPoA on 1 April 2022. The overarching goals of the DPoA are to achieve rapid, sustainable and inclusive recovery from the pandemic, build resilience against future shocks, eradicate extreme poverty, enable graduation from LDC category, ensure access to sustainable and innovating financing, leverage the power of science and technology and innovation, bring structural transformation and achieve SDGs. It comprises an ambitious, comprehensive and wide-ranging set of actions and targets. The LDC5 will be held in Doha, Qatar from 5 to 9 March 2023. Short video H.E.
