

The Antigua and Barbuda Agenda for SIDS

- A Renewed Declaration for Resilient Prosperity
- 1. Formally adopted at the 4th International Conference for SIDS, 30 May 2024 in Antigua and Barbuda
- 2. Outlines SIDS' development priorities, 2024 2034
- 3. Builds on the
 - 1. SAMOA Pathway (2014 2024);
 - 2. The Mauritius Strategy for the Further Implementation of the BPOA (2004 2014)
 - 3. The Barbados Programme of Action (1994 2004).





The ABAS is formally adopted during the 4th International Conference on SIDS, Antigua and Barbuda, 30 May 2024.




