Second Global Sustainable Transport Conference

- 14-16 October 2021 in Beijing, China
- Hybrid format - virtual and limited in-person participation

- Ministers' Forum
- Forum on Science, Technology and Innovation for Sustainable Transport
- Forum on the Role of Business in advancing sustainable transport
- Six thematic sessions

Topics - Second Global Sustainable Transport Conference

Content of six thematic sessions:

- All modes of transport—road, rail, aviation and waterborne—will be addressed
- Key transport objectives, such as access for all while leaving no one behind, green mobility, efficiency, safety and resilience, will be discussed
- Topics covered: sustainable transport and poverty eradication, livelihoods and economic recovery; sustainable transport and regional development; sustainable transport and connectivity; green development; policies for sustainable transport; sustainable transport and sustainable cities; role of science, technology, innovation and the private sector for sustainable transport
- Concerns of the poor, women, the youth, older people, persons with disabilities, and other groups, as well as of countries in special situations, including LLDCs, will receive particular focus
