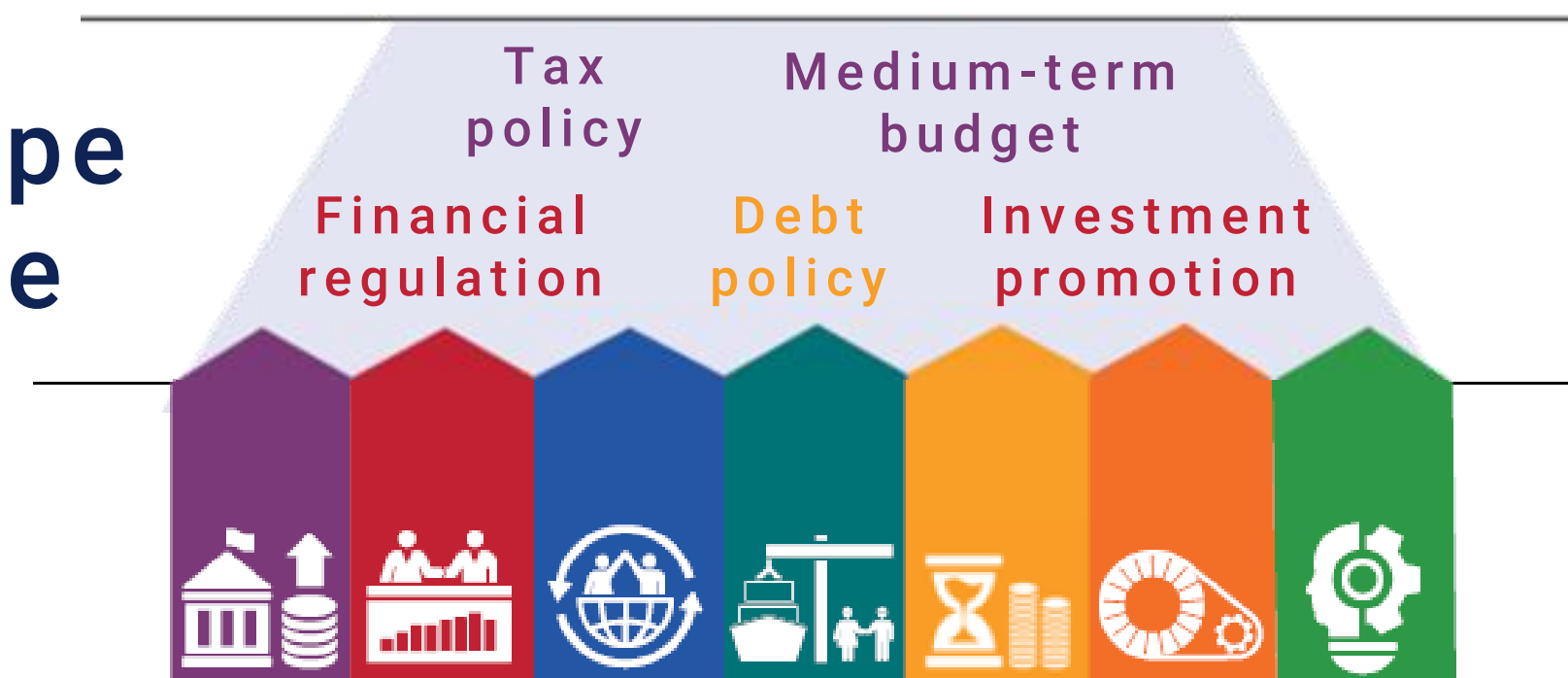

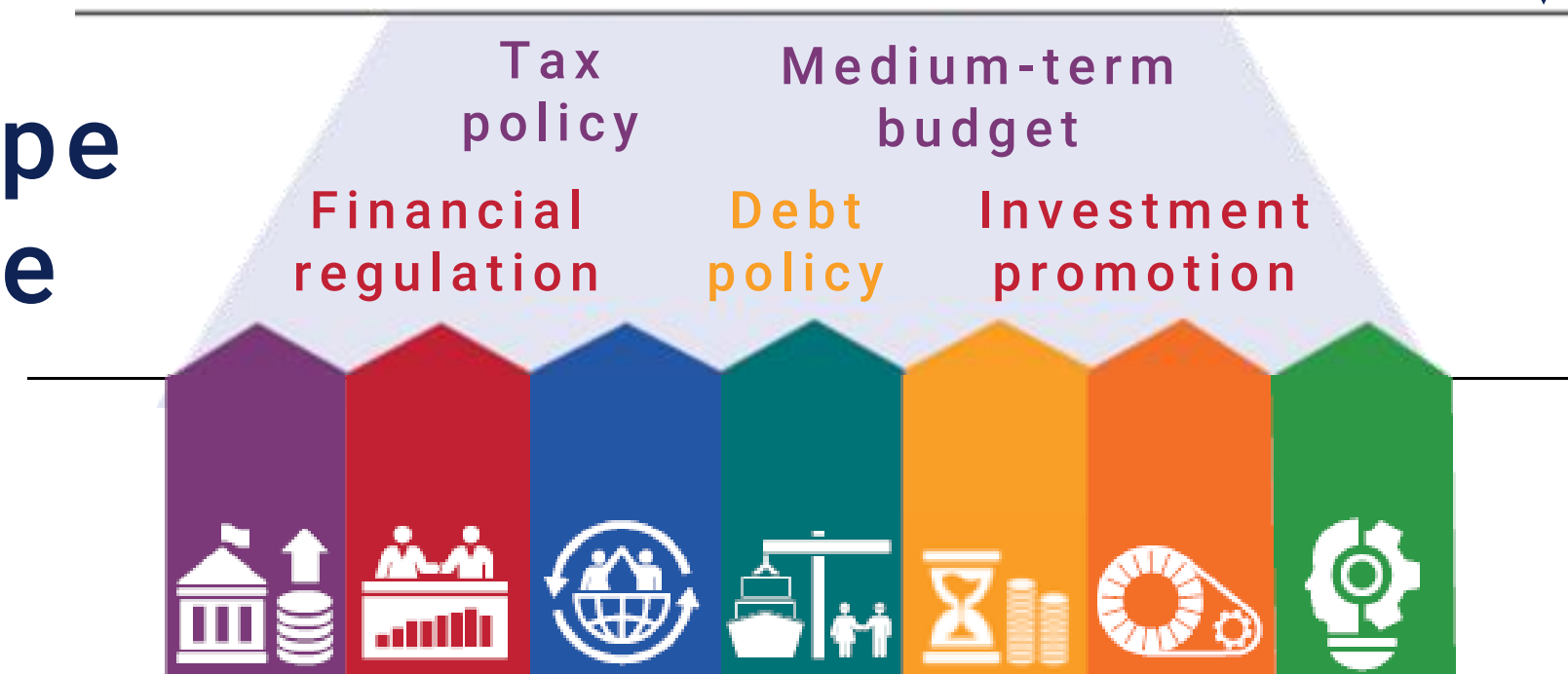

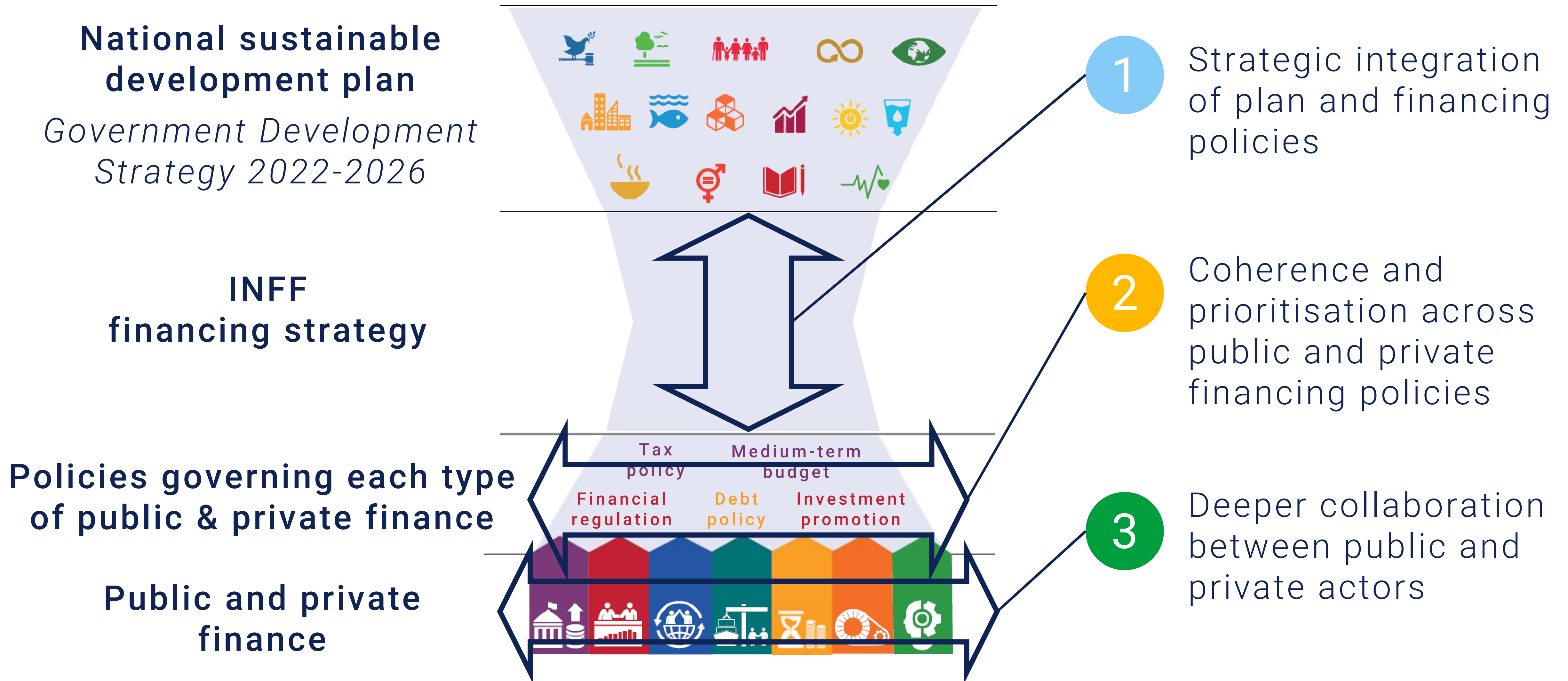

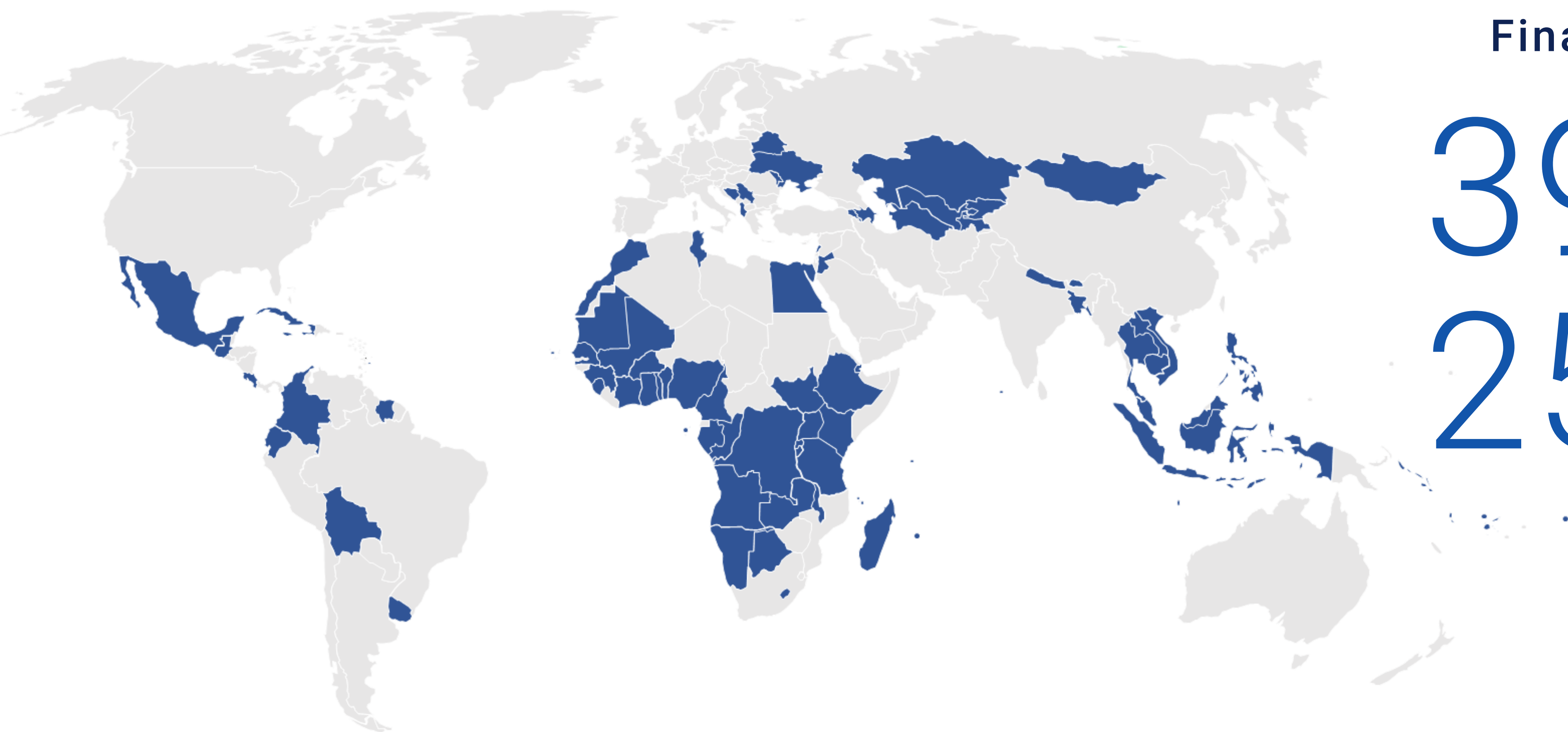

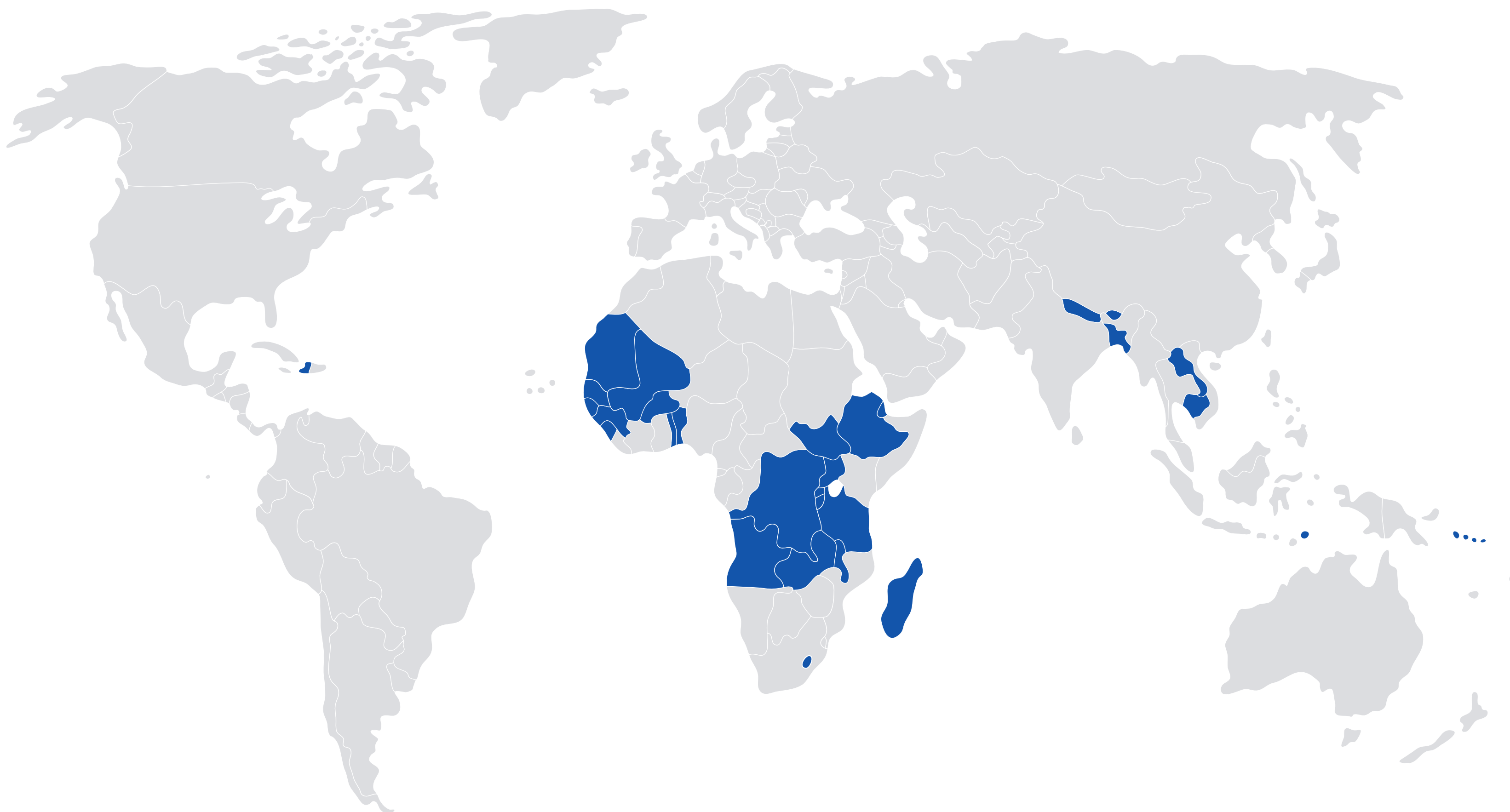

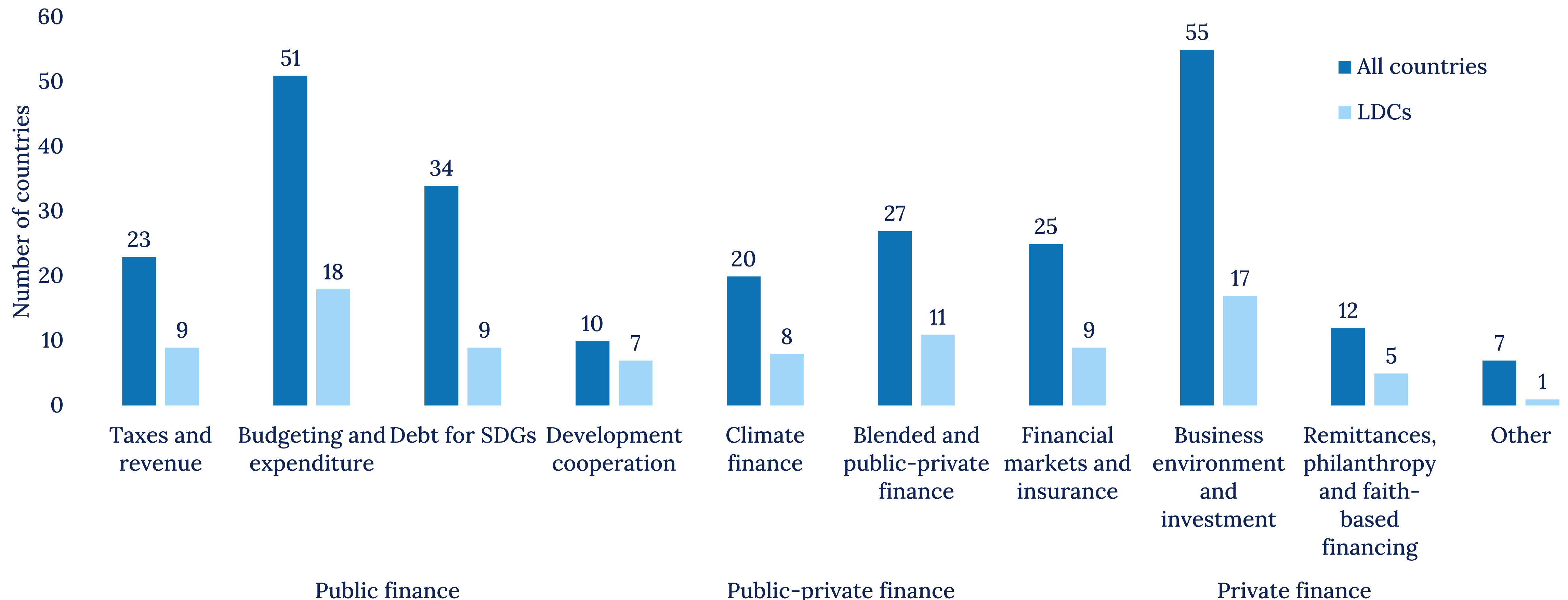
- Third Five Year National Development Plan
- Reforms:
 - Tax policy
 - SME financing
 - Alternative project financing
- Subnational INFF for Zanzibar

Djibouti

- Supports Djibouti Inclusion, Connectivity and Institutions plan to 2030
- Ministry of Economy and Finance in charge of Industry; INFF technical committee
- Four objectives:
 - i. Increased SDG investment
 - ii. Increased DRM
 - iii. Accelerated private finance
 - iv. Introduction of innovative financing
