I. Col. Ademola Lawal (rtd)

Head of Research, Savannah Centre for Diplomacy, Democracy and Development

Col. Abdulwahab Ademola Lawal has been the head of research at the Savannah Centre for Diplomacy, Democracy and Development since 2016.
