Guylain Nyembo Mbwizya

Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Planning and Coordination of Development Aid, DRC

Born in Kinshasa in 1972, Guylain Nyembo Mbwizya is an economist with a degree in Economics and Management from the University of Mons-Hainaut, Belgium. He built a two-decade career in business finance with multinational companies such as LyondellBasell and Super Maritime.

In 2019, he was appointed Deputy Chief of Staff to President Félix Tshisekedi, later becoming Chief of Staff in 2021, where he led governance reforms, strengthened transparency in public finance, and oversaw major renegotiations of strategic mining and infrastructure contracts.

On 28 May 2024, he was named Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Planning and Coordination of Development Aid. In April 2025, he represented the DRC at the Harvard Ministerial Leadership Forum, presenting the country's priority objective of creating 6.4 million jobs by 2028 under the National Development Plan (PNSD 2024–2028).

Christian Kitungwa Muteba - Governor of Tanganyika Province

Christian Kitungwa Muteba, born in Kolwezi (Lualaba, DRC), has been Governor of Tanganyika Province since April 2024. A politician and sports leader, he was elected both national and provincial deputy in Kalemie during the December 2023 elections, before securing the governorship with a record majority. Often referred to as the "Magufuli of Tanganyika," he is a member of the *Agissons et Bâtissons* political group and has

served as president of FC Tanganyika since 2022.

He holds a Bachelor's degree in Internal Security and a Master's in Governance, Peace and Conflict Resolution from the University of Lubumbashi, where he is currently pursuing a PhD in Criminology. His professional career spans private sector management, oversight of DDR programs with the African Development Bank and the National Institute of Professional Preparation, Chief of Staff to the Haut-Katanga Provincial Minister of Mines, and Administrator of the state-owned oil company COBIL SA.

As Governor, he has introduced a five-year development plan focused on strengthening security, enhancing the province's economic appeal, and reforming the mining sector in Tanganyika, a province rich in lithium, cobalt, and gold.
