Based on the following elements of the Secretary-General's New Agenda for Peace:

Prevention of conflict and violence, and sustainable peace Action 4 on accelerating the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development by addressing the drivers underlying violence and insecurity,

Member States can by mutual agreement follow the necessary steps to create and implement "first 1000 days of life" projects in all countries.

Indeed, different governments such as the UK and France have set up a "first 1000 days of life" project from conception to the age of two.

Experts have proven that what we experience during the 9 months of our intrauterine life, has a preponderant influence on our adult life.

We recommend that all Member States promote such projects within their governments so that every human being has the opportunity to form his body in the best conditions of peace and security, developing his innate potential to the fullest.

This is key to achieving the following SDGs: SDG 2 Improve nutrition, SDG3 Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages and SDG16 Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, ensure access to justice for all and establish, at all levels, effective, accountable and inclusive institutions.

It is governments that hold the power to improve the physical, emotional, mental and spiritual health of their people through the implementation of "first 1000 days of life" projects. The Peacebuilding Commission can intervene in the realization of a common agreement between the Member States specifying the steps to be followed in order to create such projects, based on the experience of the UK and the France which are pilot States in this field.
