UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Frameworks are an important opportunity for this, and we will support the UN in developing this kind of coherent, strategic thinking.

The global response to COVID-19 has shown the value of the multilateral system. The UK stands by you and looks forward to working with you all towards building sustained peace.
