Our Recommendations:

- 1. Health and educational services should be free or low-cost and provided by educators and healthcare providers, who are non-judgmental;
- 2. Healthcare workers are trained in providing age-appropriate health information and welcoming towards adolescents' health and contraceptive needs;
- 3. Availability of preventive services such as birth-control, psychological counseling, and/or testing for sexually transmitted diseases.
- 4. Ensure the health, safety and well-being of all women- and men-workers.
- 5. Promote education, training and professional development for women of all ages.
- 6. Measure and publicly report on progress to achieve gender equality at regional, national and international levels.
- 7. Building the evidence-base, mainly community-based research that is affordable and has immediate implications for programs and local partners.
- 8. Provide strong and coherent leadership in support of Member States' priorities and efforts, building effective partnership and civil society and other relevant actors.

Quality education and providing timely evidence-based information in health-sector, which is accessible to all, and reliable disaggregated data, will be needed to help with the measurements of progress of all Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), especially in health and education sectors. To ensure that no one is left behind, open science, artificial intelligence (AI) and Big Data Management will be the key to the decision-making process, in the future. The utilization of AI and Big Data can be capitalized upon through the construction of dynamic, robust and

inclusive public data ecosystems, via UN funded data co-operatives and algorithmic accountability programs.
