The hearing will take place in Trusteeship Council Chamber.

The interactive hearing will provide representatives of Member States, observers of the General Assembly, national human rights institutions compliant with the Paris Principles, non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council, accredited civil society organizations, academic institutions, parliaments and the private sector, with an opportunity to contribute constructively to the preparations for the intergovernmental conference on international migration and the global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration.

I am pleased to enclose herewith the provisional agenda of the hearing. A more detailed programme for the hearing will be provided in due course.

I encourage representatives of Member States to participate in the hearing.

Preparatory process for the global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration and the intergovernmental conference on international migration

18 December 2017 Trusteeship Chamber, UN Headquarters, New York

Theme:

The third multi-stakeholder hearing will focus on the importance of a whole-of-society approach to migration at the local and national levels. A whole-of-society approach to migration has been often cited in the discussions on the global compact for regular, safe and orderly migration, recognizing the importance of involving different actors in policy-making and implementation. The practical implications and concrete examples of successful cooperation and partnerships merit further attention.

The hearing will provide an opportunity for participants to discuss the need for cooperation and partnerships between different segments of society, including civil society, the private sector, diaspora communities, migrants, local and national authorities, schools, academia and others to develop and implement a coherent and whole-of-society approach to migration.
