High-level event on "Women in Power"

12 March 2019

Logistics Note

1. Overview

The President of the General Assembly will host a high-level event on 'Women in Power' on 12 March 2019. The high-level event will bring together senior leaders and other participants from governments, observers of the GA, the UN system, private sector and civil society to identify barriers that hinder women's full participation and leadership, and to share best practices that can accelerate women's empowerment in this area.

The schedule of the meeting will be as follows:

11:45 a.m1:00 p.m.	High-level roundtable: 'Future of Women's Leadership' (Trusteeship Council Chamber)
1:15-2:45 p.m.	High-level luncheon with young women leaders (Delegates Dining Room, by invitation only)

2. Registration and scating for Member States

The high-level event will be open to Member States of the General Assembly registered for the sixty-third session of the Commission on the Status of Women. The deadline for registration to the sixty-third session of the Commission on the Status of Women is 27 February 2019.

Seating for Member States of the General Assembly will follow the General Assembly seating protocol for the 73rd session. Member States will be assigned two seats: one at the table and one adviser seat.

3. High-level roundtables

Each high-level roundtable will include speakers invited by the President of the General Assembly. The introductory statements by all speakers is expected to last around 30 minutes, after which the floor will be open for informal interventions.

Discussions in the high-level roundtable are intended to be interactive in nature, and there will be no pre-established list of speakers. Time limits for interventions will be two minutes.

PaperSmart Services will be available for the high-level event. Delegations are kindly requested to submit electronic versions of their interventions for posting on the PaperSmart portal to papersmart@un.org. The title and the date of the meeting should be indicated in the subject line of the e-mail. Member States and observers who cannot intervene within the timeframe of the high-level roundtables may also submit it to PaperSmart.

4. Participation of other stakeholders

a. Observers of the General Assembly and the United Nations system, including funds, programmes and specialized agencies

Observers of the General Assembly and the United Nations system, including funds and programmes, and specialized agencies of the United Nations, will have designated seating on a first come, first served basis.

b. Access for NGOs

A limited number of seats in the 3rd floor gallery of the Trusteeship Council Chamber will be available to representatives of non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) that are registered to participate in the sixty-third session of the Commission on the Status of Women. The registration for non-governmental organizations in consultative status with ECOSOC to participate in CSW has been concluded. The use of the seats will require secondary tickets, to be distributed on a first-come first-served basis in the Visitor Lobby of the General Assembly Building on 11 March 2019 at 3.00 pm.

5. Media Accreditation and Liaison

Media are welcome to cover the high-level event and to conduct press encounters, in accordance with the United Nations media accreditation procedure. The accreditation for the sixty-third session of the Commission on the Status of Women closes on 7 March 2019.

Regarding accreditation, media accompanying Heads of State or Government or Heads of Delegation, including official photo and video, must request media passes in advance through the eAccreditation system on the e-Delegate portal: https://delegate.un.int/.
