Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to my letter dated 31 July 2019, on the High-level review of the Small Island Developing States Accelerated Modalities of Action (SAMOA) Pathway, to be held on Friday 27 September, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., in the Trusteeship Council Chamber, at United Nations Headquarters in New York, pursuant to General Assembly resolutions 71/225 and 72/307, and decision 73/522.

In regard to the interactive dialogue segment of each roundtable, I had previously indicated that – in order to comply with the multi-stakeholder nature of the mandate – all effort would be made to accommodate twenty-two high-level speakers comprising of participating States, and other stakeholders including relevant intergovernmental organizations and other entities that have observer status with the General Assembly, specialized agencies and United Nations system entities, associate members of regional commissions, and a civil society representative.

I have been pleased to see such a strong interest for participation in the interactive dialogue segments. As such, the attached provisional lists of speakers for the interactive dialogues contain more speakers than can be accommodated in the time available. The provisional lists have been prepared based on the level of representation, with priority given to Heads of State and Government, on a first come, first served basis, and with due consideration to geographical and gender balance. In addition, waitlists of delegations that could not be accommodated at this stage have been prepared.

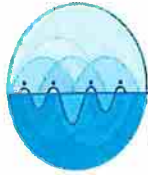
In the instance that the intended level of participation changes, the delegation would be the final speaker in the adjusted level of participation, which may include being placed in the waitlist. If a delegation withdraws, the first speaker on the waitlist may be invited to make an intervention. In this way, it is my hope that all high-level speakers will be accommodated in the high-level review. I would like to remind all speakers of the importance of adhering to the three-minute time limit for statements, so that all inscribed speakers can be heard in the limited time available.
