1. The present statement is made in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly.

2. Under the terms of the third paragraph of draft decision A/74/L.62, the General Assembly would postpone the biennial meeting of States, scheduled from 15 to 19 June 2020, to consider key challenges and opportunities relating to the Implementation of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects and the International Tracing Instrument, to a period in 2021 to be decided by the Assembly, at its 75th session.

3. The adoption of the draft decision would not entail any budgetary implications with regard to the programme budget. Upon a further decision by the General Assembly on the dates of the biennial meeting of States, the Secretary-General would reassess the budgetary implications and advise the General Assembly, in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedures of the General Assembly. Furthermore, in accordance with established practice, the dates of the biennial meeting of States would be determined in consultation with the Department for General Assembly and Conference Management.
