Subject: Twenty-fifth anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women

Excellency,

Reference is made to the General Assembly resolution 73/340 entitled, “*Scope, modalities, format and organization of the high-level meeting on the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women*” which, requests the President of the General Assembly, with the support of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women) to organize and preside over an interactive multi-stakeholder hearing in advance of the high-level meeting of the General Assembly to celebrate the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women. Due to the expected continued limitations on holding large in-person meetings as a result of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic until the end of July 2020, I recommend that the interactive multi-stakeholder hearing currently scheduled for 21 July 2020, be held via a virtual platform. Further details and concept note of the multi-stakeholder hearing will be communicated in due course.

By its resolution 73/340 (operative paragraph 6), the General Assembly requested, “*the President of the General Assembly to draw up a list of other relevant representatives of relevant non-governmental organizations and civil society organizations, including individuals whose efforts have supported the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform of Action and the human rights addressed therein, national human rights institutions, where they exist, academic institutions and the private sector, who may attend the high-level meeting of the General Assembly to be held on 23 September 2020 and participate in the interactive multi-stakeholder hearing, taking into account the principles of transparency and equitable geographical representation, with due regard to the full and meaningful participation of women and young people, and to submit the list to Member States for their consideration on a non-objection basis.*”

Following a review by the Secretariat in accordance with standard practice, I have the pleasure to enclose, herewith, a list of non-governmental organizations, civil society organizations, academic institutions, the private sector and individuals that have applied to participate in the interactive multi-stakeholder hearing scheduled for 21 July 2020, as well as for the high-level meeting of the General Assembly.
