Dear Excellencies

This year marks the fifteenth anniversary of the creation of the United Nations peacebuilding architecture. In resolutions A/RES/70/262 and S/RES/2282 (2016), the General Assembly and the Security Council called for a "comprehensive review of United Nations peacebuilding" to be conducted during the 74th session of the General Assembly. In resolutions A/RES/72/276 and S/RES/2413 (2018), the Assembly and Council requested the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly, at its 74th session, "a detailed report in connection with the next comprehensive review of the peacebuilding architecture, focusing on continued implementation of resolution 70/262, and progress in the implementation of the recommendations and options contained in his report on peacebuilding and sustaining peace".

In your joint letter dated 31 October 2019, the President of the General Assembly and the President of the Security Council launched the review process, noting that it should be based on the Terms of Reference suggested by the Peacebuilding Commission after extensive and inclusive consultations with Member States. The first, and informal, phase of the review process was concluded on 31 August 2020 and provided analysis and recommendations from a broad range of stakeholders¹ for the consideration of Member States during the second, formal, phase which is scheduled to begin today, and for the consideration of the Secretary-General in the drafting of his report on Peacebuilding and Sustaining Peace. The report, an unedited version of which was circulated in late July, will be officially released in the coming days and will be the main substantive input in the second phase of the review.

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¹ The informal phase consisted of three separate tracks: an intergovernmental track, led by the Peacebuilding Commission, which convened meetings open to all Member States; inputs from a group of independent eminent persons nominated by the Secretary-General; and inputs from regional and thematic consultations which brought together Member States, civil society organizations, think tanks, etc.

In accordance with the Terms of Reference, the President of the General Assembly and the President of the Security Council appointed us on 15 July 2020 to co-facilitate the intergovernmental consultations that will take place during the second phase of the review. It is our intention to facilitate an inclusive and consultative process aimed at generating agreed recommendations, in the form of a zero draft of new twin resolutions, for the consideration of the Assembly and the Council before the end of the main part of the seventy-fifth session, as per decision A/74/564 of the General Assembly.
