United against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance

The General Assembly

Adopts the following political declaration of the high-level meeting of the General Assembly to commemorate the twentieth anniversary of the adoption of the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action:¹

United against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance

We, Heads of State and Government and representatives of States and Governments, gathered at United Nations Headquarters in New York on 22 September 2021, on the occasion of the high-level meeting of the General Assembly to commemorate the twentieth anniversary of the adoption of the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action¹; (based on A/RES/66/3, PP1)

1. Reaffirm that the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action, adopted in 2001¹ and the outcome document of the Durban Review Conference, adopted in 2009, as well as the Political Declaration² of the tenth anniversary of its adoption, provide a comprehensive United Nations framework and solid foundation for combating racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance and reaffirm our commitment to their full and effective implementation; (based on A/RES/66/3, OP 1 and OP2)

2. Reaffirm that racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance constitute a negation of the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations and of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and that equality and non-discrimination are fundamental principles of international law; (A/RES/66/3, OP5)

3. Recall the importance of the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination as the principal international instrument to prevent, combat and eradicate racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance, and of the Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, as well as of universal ratification and effective implementation of the Convention; (A/RES/66/3, OP6)

4. Reaffirm our commitment to leave no one behind and to that end, the urgency for all countries to come together to fulfil the promise of the United Nations and our determination to implement the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in full and on time, as well as our commitment to international cooperation and multilateralism and to build trust to ensure the future we want by, inter alia, addressing the root causes of discrimination in all its forms and of inequalities, within and among countries, as well as their growing manifestations, which contribute to acts of xenophobia, racism,

intolerance, hate speech and disinformation; (based on A/RES/75/1, OP1, OP7 and OP12)

5. Acknowledge and profoundly regret the untold suffering and evils inflicted on millions of men, women and children as a result of slavery, the slave trade, the transatlantic slave trade, colonialism, apartheid, genocide and past tragedies, as these constitute serious violations of human rights and, in some cases, qualify as crimes against humanity; (A/RES/69/16, OP17 i)

6. Welcome the progress made in many parts of the world in the fight against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance since 2001, while acknowledging with concern that, in spite of concerted efforts by the international community in the past twenty years, building on efforts of the past decades, the scourge of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance, including their new forms and manifestations, still persist in all parts of the world and countless human beings continue to be victims to the present day; (based on A/RES/66/3, OP3 and OP4)

7. Further acknowledge, with deep concern, the rise in discrimination, hate speech, stigmatization, racism, systemic racism, stereotypes, racial profiling violence, xenophobia and intolerance, both in person and on-line, directed against, inter alia, Africans and people of African descent, Asians and people of Asian descent, indigenous peoples, Roma, as well as motivated by Islamophobia, anti-Semitism, Christianophobia or prejudices against persons of other religions or beliefs, and against women and children, persons in vulnerable situations, refugees, forcibly displaced persons, asylum seekers, internally displaced persons, migrants, persons with disabilities, older persons and youth; (based on A/RES/75/188, OP4 and OP 11 and on A/74/L.92, PP 25)

8. Note with concern the disproportionate impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the existing inequalities between groups within our societies and regret that, in that context, persons belonging to racial and ethnic minorities and to other specific groups have been victims of racist violence, threats to violence, physical harassment and stigmatization;

9. Resolve to pursue our common goal of ensuring the effective enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms for all, including for victims of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance in all societies, while continuing to promote the respect for human rights and to enhance democracy, good governance and the rule of law by strengthening transparency and accountability, independent judicial institutions and fight against impunity, nationally and internationally; (based on A/RES/75/1, OP10)

10. Recall the proclamation of 31 August as the International Day for People of African Descent;

11. Reiterate that the primary responsibility for effectively combating acts of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance lies with States and affirm that, whenever they occur, they must be condemned and their reoccurrence prevented; (based on DDP, para 15)

12. Note with appreciation the adoption of legislative measures and the establishment of specialized national mechanisms to combat racism, racial

discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance and recognize the need to integrate a gender perspective into relevant policies, strategies and programmes of action in order to address multiple and intersecting forms of discrimination; (based on DDPa, para 69)

13. Aim to ensure that people of African descent have full access to effective protection and remedies through the competent national tribunals and other State institutions against any acts of racial discrimination, and the right to seek from such tribunals just and adequate reparation or satisfaction for any damage suffered as a result of such discrimination; (A/RES/69/16, OP 17 d)

14. Recall Human Rights Council resolution 43/1 of 19 June 2020 and take note with appreciation of the report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, submitted pursuant to that resolution, on the promotion and protection of human rights and fundamental freedoms of Africans and of people of African descent against excessive use of force and other human rights violations by law enforcement officers;

15. Firmly believe that sustainable development and the full promotion, protection and implementation of all international human rights norms, obligations and commitments are crucial to prevent acts of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance and commit to promote measures to counter and address those acts, including through education, media and sport; (based on DDPa, para 80 and 86)

16. Call on all States, the United Nations system and international and regional organizations and invite all relevant stakeholders, including parliaments, civil society, private sector and academia, to fully commit themselves and to intensify their efforts in the fight against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance, and welcome the continued engagement of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights in mainstreaming the implementation of the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action into the United Nations system; (A/RES/66/3, OP11)

17. Proclaim together our strong determination to mobilize political will at the national, regional and international levels and to accelerate momentum to make the fight against racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance, and the protection of the victims thereof, a high priority for our countries. (A/RES/66/3, OP12)
