Excellency,

In our capacity as co-facilitators for the resolution on the review of the functioning of the Resident Coordinator system, we write to inform you that the next informal consultation will take place in Wednesday 8 September from 10:00am – 1:00pm at Conference Room 1, 2 and 3 at the United Nations Headquarters.

As indicated in our letter dated 30 July 2021, we believe we have made great strides in our collective commitment to approach the review process as a critical milestone for the Resident Coordinator system. However, the consultations up until now have also been characterized by diverging views on the question of the funding model for the reinvigorated Resident Coordinator system.

For our meeting this coming Wednesday, we will be dedicating the meeting solely to discuss the potential funding streams underpinning the Resident Coordinator system going forward. We hope and anticipate that Member States have used the time since our last consultation to engage with their capitals as well as consult and discuss among each other. We encourage Member States to come prepared and with the highest degree of flexibility in order for us to assess, whether there is a consensus on a funding model, different from the current one in place, which can deliver more adequate, predictable and sustainable funding.
