Equiano. Stories tells the story of Olaudah Equiano, an 11-year-old boy living in a vibrant Igbo village in West Africa, in 1756. Deeply connected to his family and community, he happily documents his life in the village through stories shared with his followers. But one day, Equiano and his sister are kidnapped from their home. They are separated, and Equiano is transported alone, by foot, to Africa's Western shore. There he is made to board a slave ship.
