BACKGROUND:

The International Day, established by A/RES/64/13 in November 2009, celebrates, and promotes Nelson Mandela's values and dedication to conflict resolution, race relations, human rights, reconciliation, gender equality, the rights of children and other vulnerable groups, as well as the fight against poverty and the promotion of social justice. Mandela Day has been, and remains, focused on public service, as per Nelson Mandela's wish. Every year since 2010, individuals around the world are encouraged to act and inspire change by devoting at least 67 minutes to community service on 18 July. The number 67 signifies the 67 years that Nelson Mandela devoted to public service.

The Nelson Mandela Foundation has themed this year's call to action: "It's still in our hands to combat poverty and inequity".

This year thematic areas of focus on restoration of habitats following the COVID pandemic. In particularly, rehabilitation of an area called Volunteer Hill. Volunteers will continue to remove invasive plants that have taken over the area to improve the health of the plants and introduce new native plantings. Teams will work to remove invasive plants and roots to establish new growth and protect the many apple trees that top this location.
