The Workshop is held in accordance with the programme of work for the period 2017-2020 for the second cycle of the Regular Process and is intended to support the development of the second world ocean assessment by enabling the collection of regional-level data and enabling relevant members of writing teams to meet.

Member States of the United Nations, members of United Nations specialized agencies and relevant organizations, bodies, funds or programmes within the United Nations system, are kindly invited to submit the attached nomination form for their technical expert to the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea (temnova@un.org, with a copy to marco.boccia@un.org and doalos@un.org), as soon as possible and no later than Monday, 12 November. Nominations should have due regard to the need for gender balance and should take into account the Guidelines, in particular the section on "Purpose and objectives".

In selecting participants, priority will be given to nominees from the host country and from States from the South Pacific region, as well as to relevant members of the writing teams, including with regard to funding of experts from developing countries.
