Objective

1. To increase awareness of the World Ocean Assessment (WOA) in bridging the science-policy interface.

To highlight the new components of the third WOA, specifically the integration and consideration of socio-economic and environmental aspects, and development of sustainability pathways for ocean sectors.
To identify synergies and opportunities for collaboration with relevant UN bodies, other

intergovernmental processes and the Ocean Decade community on these topics.

Expected outcome

1. Expanded awareness of the role of the WOA in bridging science and policy and the new components of the assessment being introduced in the third cycle.

2. Identification of opportunities for Ocean Decade community involvement in the assessment.

3. Identification of opportunities for enhancement of content of the assessment from the Ocean Decade community, particularly with a focus on sustainable pathways for ocean sectors.

Targeted audience

The target audience includes Governments, UN Bodies, intergovernmental processes, the UN Ocean Decade scientific community, NGOs and the public.

Format

This on-site event will be 75 minutes long.

The event will consist of an opening segment which will provide an overview of the Regular Process and its World Ocean Assessments, a moderated discussion on how other relevant assessments' processes can support the WOA and vice versa, followed by moderators' concluding remarks.
