A COORDINATED UN APPROACH TO THE RULE OF LAW

The Global Focal Point for the Rule of Law (GFP) is a United Nations platform co-chaired by DPO and UNDP that is designed to strengthen the provision of rule of law assistance to address and prevent violent conflict, to protect human rights and to restore justice and security for conflictaffected people. The GFP is a field-focused arrangement that enables United Nations entities, including UNODC, UNHCR, OHCHR, EOSG, UNOPS, UN Women, ToE and UNICEF to jointly pursue shared objectives, in accordance with their mandates and capacities. GFP partners promote United Nations norms and standards, including gender mainstreaming and human rightsbased approaches.

GFP coordinating platforms and working group arrangements are established **both at Headquarters and in the field** to increase United Nations coherence, align strategies

and programmes with national development plans, serve as **a** single entry point for host governments, and achieve better results drawing on the expertise of the contributing agencies.

Through joint assessments, planning, and programming, the GFP arrangement has been supporting a coordinated United Nations approach to rule of law assistance, relying primarily on voluntary funding and striving to increase impact and results by:

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS



Joint Rule of Law Programming in the Central African Republic

UNDP, MINUSCA and the Team of Experts on Sexual Violence in Conflict are implementing the joint rule of law programme to provide 'Support to the Rule of Law and Reform of the Justice and Security Sectors in CAR' in 2020-2023. The programme aims at supporting the reform of the justice and prison sectors, the deployment of the Internal Security Forces closer to the population and the improvement of women's access to justice and security, including through the investigation and prosecution of gender-based violence cases. In October 2022, the Special Criminal Court (SCC) has issued its first verdict on war crimes and crimes against humanity.



Joint Rule of Law and Conflict Prevention Programming in Mali

UNDP and UN Women (formerly with MINUSMA) continue the implementation of the joint rule of law and conflict prevention programme "Programme in support to the stabilization of Mali by strengthening the Rule of Law" (PROSMED). The programme, which was originally planned until 2025, links its support to security and justice sectors with conflict prevention, fight against corruption and prevention of violent extremism. The focus on complementarity of capacities and expertise has ensured that the project can continue making an impact during the drawdown of MINUSMA. Data collected through perception surveys shows that people's trust in security forces increased by 13% since inception of the programme in 2020.



Joint Justice and Corrections Programme in Somalia

Since 2015, **UNDP**, **UNSOM** and **UNODC** have been implementing joint rule of law and justice and corrections programmes since 2015 with interventions related to institutional development, people-centred justice sector reform and service delivery. The project effectively supports formal and informal rule of law actors to design and implement integrative justice **solutions** through generative dialogues, promoting political dialogue, collection of data and coordination, to facilitate the process towards a Somali Justice and which Corrections Model is people-centred, nationally owned and sustainable. A series of Community Conversations were organized on justice, security and land issues for over 7,000 people.



Strengthening Gender Parity for Uniformed Corrections Personnel

The GFP supported an initiative to strengthen the deployment of women corrections officers to UN peace operations as government-provided personnel (GPP). The project increased women officers' awareness of deployment opportunities, e.g. through the launch of the United Nations Women Corrections Officers Network which already counts 800 members from more than 25 countries. In addition, the project helped build inclusive and empowering work environments for women GPP through a series of virtual dialogue sessions on gender bias and stereotyping and how to be a gender ally, attended by 120 GPP from six peace operations, which was accompanied by a social media campaign.
