Introduction

- Border security-related obligations SCR 1373 (2001), as elaborated by subsequent resolutions, including 2309 (2016), 2341 (2017), 2370 (2017), 2482 (2019), and 2617(2021)...
- Effective border management is of particular importance with respect to FTFs, as reflected in resolutions 2178 (2014) and 2396 (2017).
- Border security includes control on the movement of people and goods across borders, and prevention of unlawful interference in maritime navigation and international aviation.
- API and PNR, use of biometrics, and use of watch lists or databases, integrated in CTED assessments and dialogue with Member States.




Global API / iAPI Implementation Status

Systems to collect biometric data to responsibly and properly identify terrorists, including FTFs Main Global Implementation Challenges



Conclusion

I. Support States in strengthening inter- and intra-agency and cross-border cooperation; and implementation of comprehensive approaches regarding border security, in accordance with international obligations, including international human rights law

II. Continue and further strengthen CTED's role as facilitator of technical assistance and work with UNOCT, and implementing entities, including under the Global Compact, to design and define capacity-building and awareness-raising efforts for States

III. Share and promote effective practices and guidelines to support effective implementation of 1373 (2001) incl. through the development of the non-binding guiding principles following the Delhi Declaration, in compliance with domestic and international law, including human rights law

IV.Explore ways to further enhance partnerships, and to identify the challenges involved in implementing critical capabilities and explore ways to support Member States with effective solutions.
