# Introduction

- **Border security-related obligations - SCR 1373 (2001), as elaborated by subsequent resolutions, including 2309 (2016), 2341 (2017), 2370 (2017), 2482 (2019), and 2617(2021)..**
- **Effective border management is of particular importance with respect to FTFs, as reflected in resolutions 2178 (2014) and 2396 (2017).**
- **Border security includes control on the movement of people and goods across borders, and prevention of unlawful interference in maritime navigation and international aviation.**
- **API and PNR, use of biometrics, and use of watch lists or databases, integrated in CTED assessments and dialogue with Member States.**



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

# Conclusion

- I. Support States in strengthening **inter- and intra-agency and cross-border cooperation**; and implementation of **comprehensive approaches** regarding border security, in accordance with international obligations, including international human rights law
  
- II. Continue and further strengthen CTED's role as facilitator of **technical assistance** and work with UNOCT, and implementing entities, including under the Global Compact, to design and define capacity-building and awareness-raising efforts for States

# Conclusion

III. **Share and promote effective practices and guidelines** to support effective implementation of 1373 (2001) incl. through the development of the non-binding guiding principles following the Delhi Declaration, in compliance with domestic and international law, including human rights law

IV. Explore ways to further **enhance partnerships**, and to identify the challenges involved in implementing critical capabilities and explore ways to support Member States with **effective solutions**.
