# Technical assistance provided by UNOCT to South-East European States on CT/PCVE

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#### **UNOCT Mandate**

- The United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT) was established on 15 June 2017 through the adoption of <u>UN General Assembly</u> Resolution 71/291.
- The UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy (<u>A/RES/60/288</u>) and its biennial General Assembly Review resolutions provide the substance of UNOCT's mandate.
- UNOCT's five main functions:
  - 1. Provide leadership on the General Assembly counter-terrorism mandates entrusted to the Secretary-General from across the United Nations system
  - 2. Enhance coordination and coherence across the Global Counter-Terrorism Coordination Compact entities to ensure the balanced implementation of the four pillars of the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy
  - 3. Strengthen the delivery of United Nations counter-terrorism capacity-building assistance to Member States
  - 4. Improve visibility, advocacy and resource mobilization for United Nations counter-terrorism efforts
  - 5. Ensure that due priority is given to counterterrorism across the United Nations system and that the important work on preventing violent extremism is firmly rooted in the Strategy

### UNCCT: Cybersecurity and New Technologies Programme



**Cybersecurity and New Technologies** 

- Supporting Member States in South-East Europe in strengthening responses to challenges of new technologies.
- Funded by the EU, the Programme provides capacity building assistance to Albania and Bosnia and Herzegovina
- Bosnia and Herzegovina is one of the 5 CT TECH Partner States which UNOCT will provide tailored capacity building assistance
- Cyber Programme contributed to the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe







#### UNCCT: Countering Terrorist Use of Weapons Programme



**Countering Terrorist Use of Weapons** 

- The Programme joined forces to promote adherence to ICSANT with Albanian Parliament and national institutions, to prevent nuclear terrorism.
- Co-organized the Med Trident tabletop exercise on nuclear detection and forensics with participants from South East Europe
- Organized a workshop for European countries on the UNSCR 2370 Technical Guidelines to prevent terrorists from acquiring SALW, IEDs, UAS





### SPIB: Countering Terrorist Travel Programme



**Countering Terrorist Travel Programme** 

- The UNOCT's CT Travel Programme is very active in South-East Europe.
- The Programme has facilitated the establishment of the UNOCT-led Eastern Europe Informal Working Group (EEIWG) on Advance Passenger Information (API) and Passenger Name Record (PNR) implementation.
- The EEIWG operates with OSCE as its Secretariat.



 The mechanism is primarily driven by its Members, notably Albania as Chair



#### SPIB: Sports Programme



**Security of Major Sporting Events and Sport for PCVE** 

- As part of the Global Sports Programme's Civil Society Grant Scheme, the Albanian Organization Center for Youth Progress executed a Project on 'A step Towards Sport, Step Away from Extremism'.
- The Global Sports Programme has established a National Focal Points (NFPs) which represents over 130 Member States, including NFPs from Bulgaria, Croatia, Montenegro and Romania





#### Areas of Concern in South-East Europe

- Increase of hate of speech, spread of disinformation, which could be conducive to violent extremism and terrorism
- Undetected return of foreign terrorist fighters from conflict zones
- Increase of far-right extremism and radicalization, including a concerning rise of violent extremist exploitation of gaming and gaming adjacent platforms
- Exploitation of new technologies and AI by terrorists
