CTED provides support and advice on the implementation of the relevant Security Council resolutions

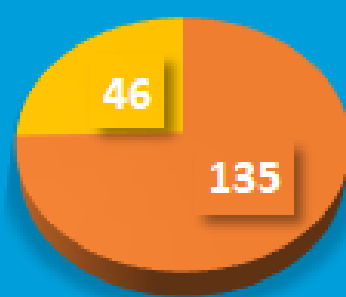
- To all 193 Member States

- Identify strengths, gaps, progress, and good practices. Described by Member States as a **"free diagnosis"**.
- Involve an in-depth, multi-stakeholder dialogue that brings together all relevant partners.
- Are produced together with the assessed Member State, thereby ensuring **transparency** and **ownership**.

Fostering dialogue

CTED holds consistent, transparent and even-handed dialogue with Member States

- CTED helps translate Security Council requirements into specific legal and operational measures that **facilitate the implementation** of those requirements by Member States.

- CTED hosts the UN's **largest counter-terrorism database**, which reflects counter-terrorism measures introduced by Member States.
- This data has enabled CTED to complete the desk-based assessments of all 193 UN Member States, continue to produce **Global implementation surveys** and analytical reports, and **prioritize key recommendations** in response to the rapidly evolving threats.

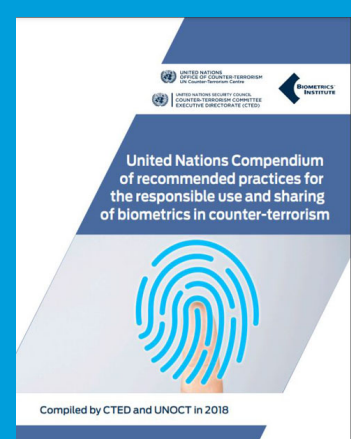
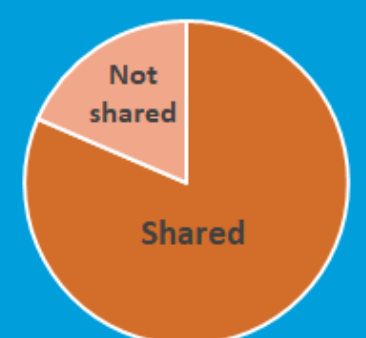
Building bridges

CTED matches identified needs with technical assistance providers able to assist the Member State meet those needs.

- Identified needs help donors and technical assistance providers focus on what will make an **impact**.

- In facilitating technical assistance delivery, CTED works to ensure that terrorism is addressed in a comprehensive, integrated manner that involves all **relevant stakeholders** (including government agencies, civil society, academia, and the private sector), on a whole-of-society basis.

81% of assessment reports adopted since 2018 have been shared with the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Compact entities

A bird's eye view

CTED identifies the latest developments in terrorist threats and trends, as well as in States' responses to terrorism.

- This is made possible through CTED's longstanding constructive dialogue with, and assessments of, Member States and its **engagement with UN entities, IROs, the private sector, academia, and CSOs**.

- CTED uses this understanding
 - To advise Member States on **how best to address terrorism** in a comprehensive and integrated manner.
 - To produce regional and thematic analytical reports on **new trends and emerging threats**, to inform counter-terrorism efforts.

Adapting to the Covid-19 pandemic

- In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, CTED adopted new, **flexible working methods** to ensure business continuity, including by conducting hybrid visits *pro tempore*.

- CTED worked to understand the **impact of the pandemic** on terrorism and counter-terrorism and made its findings available to the counter-terrorism community and the public, via 4 reports.

- CTED launched a new cloud-based **assessment and analysis portal** that hosts improved stocktaking tools and will enhance its capacity to identify new trends.



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
